Updated Burial Eligibility to Include National Guard and Reservists for Maine Veterans' Memorial Cemeteries The Maine Bureau of Veterans' Services (MBVS) is pleased to announce updates to the eligibility criteria for burial in the Maine Veterans' Memorial Cemetery System. These changes, enacted under Public Law 2022, Chapter 593, expand eligibility to include members of the Maine National Guard and certain Reserve Component members, ensuring broader access to the honor and dignity of resting in one of Maine's veterans' cemeteries.

The updated rules reflect Maine's commitment to honoring all who have served in the United States Armed Forces, National Guard, and Reserve Components. This includes Guard members and Reservists who completed their initial military service contract and received an honorable discharge, as well as those who died under specific conditions while serving. Eligible spouses and dependents also qualify for burial, preserving the legacy of family service and sacrifice.

Expanded Coverage for Guard and Reserve Members: Includes those who completed their first military service contract with an honorable discharge and those who died in the line of duty while serving in Active Guard Reserve or active state service.

Support for Spouses and Dependents: Eligible dependents include spouses, minor children, and certain adult children with disabilities.

Headstones, Markers, or Columbarium Niche Covers: The State of Maine now provides headstones or markers at no cost for eligible Guard members, Reservists, and their dependents. Funding is supported through a designated plot allowance, ensuring perpetual care for the cemeteries.

Director David Richmond of the Maine Bureau of Veterans' Services stated, "In accordance with the federal enactment of the Burial Equity Act, the State of Maine has passed the necessary legislation and allocated the resources required to honor Maine National Guard servicemembers and Reservists for their selfless service to our state—in times of war and peace—and in countless civil emergencies through the years."

BVS encourages veterans, guard members, reservists, and their families to learn about burial eligibility and plan for future needs. To ualify, individuals must meet specific service requirements and discharge conditions outlined in the new rules which can be found on our ebsite.

Women Veterans Call Center

The Women Veterans Call Center will help you navigate VA, point you in the right direction, and connect you with the Women Veterans Program Manager at your local VA medical center.

This service is free and confidential, and you can call as many times as you need. If you are a woman Veteran you may call for yourself, or a friend, relative, or caregiver may call for you.

Call or text the Women Veterans Call Center at 1-855-VA-WOMEN (1-855-829-6636) or use the online chat feature. Women Veterans Call Center representatives are available Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. ET, and Saturday, 8:00 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. ET, excluding federal holidays. If you contact the Women Veterans Call Center after hours and leave a message, you will receive a return call the next day the call center is open.

The Women Veterans Call Center is your resource for information about a variety of services and benefits that you have earned and deserve through your military service. The Women Veterans Call Center can be your first call to find out how VA can help you. No question is too big or too small, and every question is important. Examples of questions the Women Veterans Call Center can help with are:

- How to reconnect with VA health care if you applied a long time ago but never used your benefits
- How to connect with your local women's health contacts including your local Maternity Care Coordinator or Women Veterans Program Manager, who will assist in coordinating all the services you need
- How to find out what you are eligible for (including general questions about disability ratings) and other VA benefits like employment, education, and home loans
- How to refill your prescription or make an appointment

92,000 and Counting

I want to start this report by encouraging everyone to keep recruiting. And by asking the question: Can we increase the membership numbers? The answer is: YES, we can and in fact, we did. As of September 30, 2024, Vietnam Veterans of America is 92,126 members strong.

What's more, we are gaining about 200 new members a month, while losing about 90. The average number of members in any given chapter is now 120. Our chapter has approximately 185. Two new chapters have been chartered since the last report. The goal to reach 92,000 members was ambitious, yet it was accomplished with the concerted effort of VVA members across the country.

Can VVA get to 93,00 members? Again, the answer is that we can and will. Here are some statistics about Vietnam War veterans. There are some 6.6 million veterans living in America and abroad who served on active duty from November 1, 1955, to May 7, 1975, at any location around the globe. About 16 percent of American citizens are 65 years or older and 44 percent of them are males. About a third of American men 65 or older are Vietnam War veterans. That equates to about 2.1 percent of the total U>S> population based on 2020 U.S. Cences

These statistics underscore the importance of outreach and recruitment efforts to this large number of prospective members just waiting for you to invite them to join Vietnam Veterans of America. Here's a recruiting hint: Keep a sharp lookout for folks in "Vietnam veteran" ball caps.

POW MIA INFORMATION

As of October 28 2024, the number of American missing and unaccounted for from the Vietnam War is 1,574. 11 of which are from right here in the state of Maine. The countries are Vietnam (1,237); Laos (282); Cambodia (48); and the Peoples Republic of China territorial waters (7). These numbers fluctuate due to investigations resulting in changed locations of loss.

The Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency announced on October 17 that U.S. Army Warrant Officer Albert R. Trudeau, who was killed in action during the Vietnam War, was accounted for on September 11.

In October 1971, Trydeau was assigned to the 68th Aviation Company in the 17th Aviation Group's 52nd Aviation Battalion. Trudeau then 22, was the co-pilot of a CH-47B Chinook helicopter when it went down on a supply mission over water in bad weather on October 26, while flying from Tuy Hoa to Cam Ranh Bay in South Vietnam.

Remains of four of the ten soldiers on board were recovered during subsequent search and rescue operations, but Trudeau was not accounted for. The complete accounting of Trudeau's case will be published once the family receives a full briefing.
